Dear families and friends,

I hope you are all well? It would seem our Indian Summer is well and truly over...

This newsletter is full of important points, please make sure you read them carefully.

Isolating:

If an individual or year group bubble or 'pod' has to go into isolation, we will provide learning via See-Saw. All children have their own log in. Please make sure you keep this safe at home.

Every year group also has their own email address, so even if we are not at school, you can always contact us.

Clothing:

Please ensure your child has outside shoes. While keeping our pods apart, we need to use the field. It is very muddy at this time of year. If it is a rainy day and you are concerned about your child wearing soggy clothes all day, please feel free to send them in with dry bottoms/socks. They need to come in in a named bag and kept on the peg.

Food/Hot dinner:

We are committed to all our children having access to a hot meal every day. We are monitoring feedback from lunches regularly. As we cannot eat in the hall at the moment we are having to eat in our classrooms. Because of this, we are not having gravy/custard as an option with dinners. I know this is disappointing to some, but please bear with us. We cannot afford to have liquids spilt into our classroom carpets. We are also monitoring the temperature of food as it reaches the classroom. We think we are improving daily, but feedback is always gratefully received! If we cannot meet everyone's satisfaction with our hot meal offer, we will have to offer packed lunches in school instead.

Food/Packed lunches:

As a school, we are committed to ALL children being physically and emotionally healthy. Our children are working in class to look at how they can ensure all our bodies are physically healthy and that we are eating healthily.

Please support your child in choosing a healthy lunch if you provide a packed lunch from home.

Electric scooters:

It is not legal for children to be using electric scooters on public roads or footpaths. Could you please ensure your child does not come to school on an electric scooter if they have one.

Parent Teacher meetings:

You will receive a letter soon with a telephone slot to speak with your child's teacher. When you make your appointment, please make sure you are in a position to take the call as we will be working on very tight time frames with only two phone lines per school so will not have the capacity to repeatedly try to make contact.
