I have been reviewing our current school lunch offer and working with colleagues from Aspens to see how we can improve the dining experience for our children. Changing the seating arrangement that allows for children to socialise with their friends over lunch and having fewer diners in the hall at one time has

ensured that lunch times are calmer and a more positive experience for everyone. Aspens have worked hard to improve how the food is displayed and how service is conducted. One girl in Y6 asked "if lunch was always going to be so fancy?" and I reassured her it is!

A number of parents have spoken to me about their concerns re our children's safety and what can only be described as thoughtless parking. Inconsiderate and dangerous parking is increasingly causing problems around our school, putting the safety of children and others at risk. Cars parking inconsiderately or on zigzag lines cause visibility issues for pedestrians of all ages who are crossing the road to get to and from school. As a headteacher I have very limited "powers" when it comes to parking beyond that of warning parents through newsletters. I will be contacting Norfolk County Council to share my concerns and would encourage you to do the same as the current situation is not a safe one for our children.
