### <u>Intent</u>

At Wensum we believe that our curriculum should raise aspirations, develop independence and offer all children real-life experiences. These are central to the development and delivery of the curriculum in all subject areas.

The study of Religious Education helps children acquire and develop knowledge and understanding of different beliefs and practices in their communities and around the world. It enhances their spiritual, moral, social and cultural development by providing them with meaningful and challenging opportunities to ask questions and the world and to reflect on their own beliefs, values and experiences. Through our RE curriculum, our children will be able to develop the skills to hold balanced and well-informed conversations about religion and other worldviews as they begin to navigate the complex world in which they live.

#### New for 2023

We have selected four faiths to explore across Key Stage 2: Christianity, Islam, the Hindu tradition and Buddhism. The sequence of each is set out in the table below, with the time allocated to each reflecting the comparative size of the faiths across the world. The sequencing of the blocks and the associated driving questions allow for children to deepen their understanding of each faith over time while developing an awareness of common features, principles and values. RE is taught over six one week blocks across the year. These typically fall at the end of each half term and term. **This will be for first teaching from October 2023.**
