Polite reminders: Parking reminder: Please ensure when picking up and dropping off your child, you are careful when driving and parking around the school, and you are courteous and considerate of our neighbours.

We have had complaints from neighbours about littering on the school run. Please ensure any dropped litter is picked up and put in a bin.

We are encouraging children to bring healthy snacks in for their break time. This includes any fruit or vegetables, as a way of promoting healthy eating and your children having their 5-a-day.

Please ensure your child is wearing their correct uniform to school. We expect all children to follow the school dress code at all times:



- Jumpers/cardigans Royal blue. Children should wear plain it ems or featuring the school logo.
- Polo Shirts Royal blue, light blue or white can be worn. Thes e can be plain or with the school logo.
- Trousers/Skirts/Pinafore dresses/Shorts children can wear plain black or grey. No cycling shorts or leggings are allowed.
- Summer dresses/ blue or navy gingham can be worn.
- Jewellery is not permitted in school, with the exception of earrings.
- Make- Up -Is not permitted at school.
- Shoes We ask children to wear plain black outdoor shoes/trainers, a suitable style for everyday wear.
- Socks/Tights White, black or grey.

PE kits can be worn to school on the day of PE lesson, the children should wear plain black shorts and a t-shirt that is the colour of their house. When the weather gets colder, children should wear plain, unbranded black or dark colour jogging/tracksuit bottoms and a plain, unbranded sweatshirt or hoodie. They are allowed to wear their school jumper or cardigan too.

If your child is unwell and has a lunch ordered, please remember to cancel before 9am on the day, otherwise you will still be charged.
